

PROCESS OF DISPOSAL OFFENSIVE WASTE

Offensive Waste, also referred to as Non-Infectious Waste, can be a complex waste stream to manage

Offensive Waste can be considered as the following:

- Soiled nappies
- Faeces and other bodily secretions
- Disposable bed pan or bed pan inners
- Incontinence pads
- Stoma bags
- Urine containers

Once our Service Driver has collected waste from our Clients, these will be transfer to our partner Cory Environmental

Cory Environmental is our partner company who we use to dispose of waste collected from our Clients. They process it through their Sterilwave machines. These reduce the volume of the waste by around 80% by maceration leading to an end product RDF "flock" which is then compacted and sent to waste to energy facilities. The tiger bag process can reach 100 degrees so, although there should be nothing infectious in this waste stream, it is a nice "fail safe" to know that most Tiger bag processes also reach temps where sterilisation occurs
